

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APPLICATIONS FROM LESSON 23

CHARACTERISTICS OF GOD'S "PERFECT WILL"

- 1. It will mostly be the more difficult choice. The popular easy choice is the world's choice. (Gen 16)
- 2. Expect the majority to counsel you to make the worldly choice. This includes most Christians and family members. (Gen 16:1), (2 Cor. 4:4), (2 Cor. 11:13-15)
- 3. Choosing God's perfect will usually involves a season of waiting upon Him. A season can be hours, months or years. (Gen 21:1-7)
- 4. Choosing God's perfect will involve some sort of suffering. (Gen 45)
- 5. Many people in the center of God's perfect will despair of life. (Num 11:10-15), (Job 3), (Job 10-1-3), (2 Cor 1:8-9)
- 6. In God's perfect will there will be an end to the suffering enabling you to know, love and trust God more than you can imagine. (Gen 41), (Gen 46), (Phil 3:14), (Phil 4:13), (James 1:2-4)

CHARACTERISTICS OF GOD'S "PERMISSIVE WILL"

- 1. The choice violates God's word. (Gen 2:17), (Gen 3)
- 2. The choice involves immediate gratification revealing an unwillingness to wait upon God. (Gen 3:6-7)
- 3. The choice is emotionally driven not spiritually discerned. (James 1:13-14), (1 John 2:15-17)
- 4. The choice involves rejection of wise Godly counsel. (1 Kings 12:1-11)
- 5. The choice results in consequences far greater than you can imagine. (Gal. 6:7-8)
